

## Chemical Hygiene Plan (CHP)

### 1. Standardized Chemical Hygiene Plan (CHP) Purpose

The Department of Pathology at the University of Michigan Hospitals and Health Centers is required by the Occupational Health and Safety Administration (OSHA) to develop and maintain a chemical hygiene plan as stated in the Occupational Exposures to Hazardous Chemicals in Laboratories Standards, [29 CFR 1910.1450](#). This standardized chemical hygiene plan pertains to all laboratories within the Department of Pathology.

It is important that employers and employees assume responsibility for laboratory safety. All employees have access to pertinent safety information through their supervisory staff, safety officer, safety manuals, and reference materials. It is important that laboratory personnel demonstrate the ability to detect potential hazards in both the facility and in work procedures. When safety concerns arise, employees are encouraged to contact their supervisor or laboratory safety officer.
